POINTS

The accent of the fruit is as different to that of its Eden Valley sibling as one should expect, with a smoked meat/charcuterie element behind the blackberry and plum fruit; the tannins are good, as is the oak. My points are not justified on wine quality (the alcohol issue), but are given because of history.

LANGMEIL 2013 ORPHAN BANK BAROSSA SHIRAZ

68% Barossa Valley (picked 13 Feb), 32% Eden Valley (picked 20 Mar), matured for 24 months in French hogsheads (56% new). A lively, medium-bodied shiraz, light on its feet, the Eden Valley playing an important role; the fruit flavours span both red and dark, but are in no way extractive, the savoury tannins on the finish give the wine its very good texture and structure.

POINTS

Part sourced from the late (Mar ?15) Ron Schild's vineyard, but will continue with son Kevin growing the grapes. It is full-flavoured in good Barossa style, with restrained alcohol in that context; plum and blackberry provide the base, ripe tannins and subtle oak finish the package.
