

2004 Barossa Grenache 'The Fifth Wave'

Fruit sourced from our own "Jackaman's" 60 year old Lyndoch vineyard, dry grown low yielding and extremely intense, as well as fruit from a brilliant 80 year old patch of bush vines belonging to one of our growers Wally Krieg, is blended to produce this amazing, bold and complex wine.

This is a deep, dark, powerful wine which, after two years maturation in two year old American and French oak hogsheads and barriques, has developed into an intense cherries and chocolate wine with nuances of earthy spice and the typical, chalky Grenache tannin finish.

Like 'The Freedom' Shiraz, 'The Fifth Wave' Grenache is made using minimal handling techniques and is bottled after careful racking without finingt or filtration.

Colour: Medium depth red crimson

Nose:

Lifted perfume of dark cherries, raspberries and satsuma plums with lovely hints of dark chocolate, vanilla and peppery characters

Palate:

Rich fruit sweetness gives a very full mouth feel with all the fruits flowing onto the palate. Balancing the fruit is fine, silky tannins and vanillin oak characters adding to the complexity. The finish is extremely long and fruitfull with sweet spice and white pepper completing the picture.
