WINEMAKER'S NOTES

2011 VINTAGE REPORT

The 2010/2011 season presented various challenges primarily related to the La Nina weather pattern that Eastern and South-eastern Australia experienced through the recent summer and autumn seasons. Fortunately, better spray technology, 100% hand picking and understanding of diseases enabled all to avoid major disaster. The growing season was wetter than average and summer saw well above average rainfall and much cooler temperatures slowing the rate of ripening and delaying harvest. The cool summer and autumn did however produce very interesting wines showing finesse and elegance, with Shiraz and Mataro offering more pepper and spice than usual and Cabernet Sauvignon displaying excellent varietal character.

COLOUR: Medium to deep crimson with purple hues.

AROMA: A rich and inviting aroma of Satsuma plum and raspberries mingles with fine milk chocolate, cedar, white pepper and sweet spice.

PALATE: Quite a mouthful of sweet and spicy fruit but balanced wonderfully with velvety yet youthfully austere tannins. A medium bodied wine showing nice complexity with hints of cedar and vanilla, which, in combination, flows through to the lengthy, pepper and spice finish.
