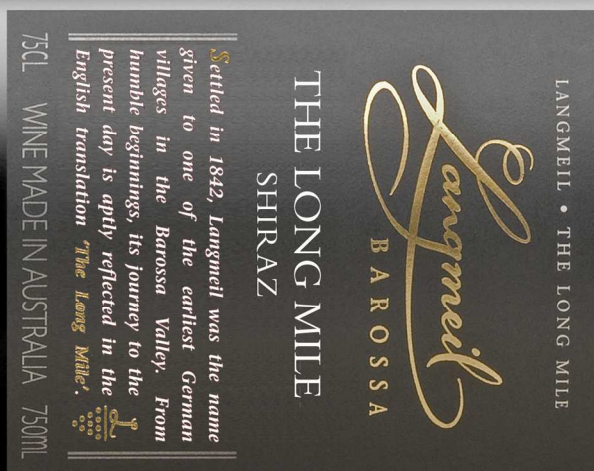

[WINEMAKING NOTES]

This wine is the epitome of the Barossa, recognised as one of the longest continuous grape growing and wine making cultures in the world. The labour and toil of generations in small family owned vineyards, being crafted into classic fruit driven Shiraz. In adding yet another page to the biography of the Barossa, Langmeil's story indeed demonstrates both it and the regions ability to consistently perform over the 'Long Mile'.

COLOUR • Medium depth crimson with purple hues.

NOSE • Delicious aromas of blue fruits, Satsuma plum and liquorice fills the nostrils with hints of Turkish delight and chocolate.

PALATE • Bright, juicy, sweet fruit flows onto the palate and is well balanced with briary spice and plenty of fine silky tannins which continue right through to the finish.

FOOD MATCHING • Ragu, BBQ sausages and steak, Pizza or matured cheddar cheese.
