

2002 Shiraz, Grenache, Mourvedre 'Three Gardens'

Colour: Deep Crimson.

Aroma: Perfumed blueberries and raspberry's with buttery

vanilla, white pepper and sweet spice nuances.

Palate: Sweet fruit fills the mouth with lovely buttery

characters some fine oak tannins and long fruit

and spicy finish.

The Shiraz component comes from Shiraz destined for the 'Valley Floor' Shiraz.

The Grenache is sourced from a 50 year old dry grown vineyard. The Mourvèdre is from a 70 year old dry grown vineyard. This is a traditional blend of varieties which have been used in the Rhône region of France for many years, and have proved to complement each other. This blend certainly suits the Barossa as this wine shows.
